



AN ACT

To further amend section 9 of Public Law No. 20-131, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 20-154, 20-159, 20-172, 20-187, 21-03, 21-10, 21-38, 21-81 and 22-55, to change the language in the funding previously appropriated to fund Enhancing Tourism for the state of Chuuk, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 9 of Public Law No. 20-131, as
2 amended by Public Laws Nos. 20-154, 20-159, 20-172, 20-187,
3 21-03, 21-10, 21-38, 21-81 and 22-55, is hereby further
4 amended to read as follows:

5 "Section 9. Capital and Human Resources Development.

6 The sum of \$40,543,837, or so much thereof as may be
7 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General
8 Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the
9 fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, for the
10 following capital improvements, development programs,
11 and projects and human resources development. Of the
12 total amount of funds appropriated herein, \$1,256,025
13 shall be deemed to come from funds available under the
14 Supplemental Education Grant and \$1,000,000 shall be
15 deemed to come from funds available under the Compact
16 Sector Grants. The sum appropriated by this section
17 shall be apportioned as follows:
