

FIFTH SPECIAL SESSION, 2022 CONGRESSIONAL BILL NO. 22-218, C.D.1, C.D.2

## AN ACT

To further amend sections 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 22-60, 22-80 and 22-103, to appropriate \$2,277,000 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the Legislative Branch of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia; and Grants, Subsidies and Contributions; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by

7	(xi) Section $9(3)(b)$ — the allottee of these
8	funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;
9	(xii) Section $9(3)(b)$ — the allottee of these
10	funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;
11	(xiv) Section $9(3)(c)$ — the allottee of these
12	funds shall be the Governor of the state of Pohnpei;
13	(xv) Section $9(3)(d)$ — the allottee of these
14	funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

1	(3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to
2	obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as of
3	September 30, 2022; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the fund
4	appropriated under section 9 of this act shall not lapse.
5	Section 7. This act shall become law upon approval by the
6	President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
7	becoming law without such approval.
