A RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, the United States through the Department of Health 2 and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration 3 (HRSA), issued a Notice of Grant Award of financial assistance on 4 April 11, 2022 in the amount of \$104,350; and

5 WHEREAS, the purpose of the grant is to fund and support the 6 implementation and development of the FSM Maternal Child Health Program 7 and its services to improve the health and well-being of mothers, 8 families, and children, for better coordination of a system of care for 9 the maternal and child health population, particularly vulnerable 10 populations who do not have access to adequate health care in the FSM; 11 and

WHEREAS, section 210(2) of title 55 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, (Annotated), as amended, provides that for foreign financial assistance to be valid it must be approved by Congress by resolution; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Twenty-Second Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia, Fourth Regular Session, 2022, that Congress hereby approves and accepts the \$104,350 grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Health Resources and
