

AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, and 12 of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-210, 21-221 and 21-238, to deappropriate \$794,754 and repurpose funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the Executive Branch; the Legislative Branch; the Judicial Branch; National Public Auditor; Agencies, Boards, Authorities, and Commissions; Grants, Subsidies and Contributions; Capital and Human Resources Development, to change the allottee of certain funds, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1           Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by  
2 Public Laws Nos. 21-210, 21-221 and 21-238, is hereby further  
3 amended to read as follows:

4           “Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to  
5           appropriate the sum of \$74,330,815 from the General Fund  
6           of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal  
7           year ending September 30, 2021, for the purpose of  
8           funding the operations of all branches of the National  
9           Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its  
10          agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and  
11          contributions and Capital and Human Resources  
12          Development. The National Government’s share of the  
13          Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT  
14          THAT; the National Government will retain the Compact  
15          Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent of the

1 Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in  
2 the budget for the Department of Education. The sum  
3 appropriated herein shall be apportioned as follows:"

4 Section 2. Section 1 of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by  
5 Public Laws Nos. 21-221 and 21-238, is hereby further amended to  
6 read as follows:

7 "Section 2. Operating Expenses of the Executive Branch.
