PUBLIC LAW NO. 22-60

AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, and 8 of Public Law No. 22-42, to appropriate \$1,630,000 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the Executive Branch, the Legislative Branch, and Grant's Subsidies, and Contributions and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 22-42 is hereby
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to
4 appropriate the sum of \$71,262,359 from the General Fund of the
5 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending
6 September 30, 2022, for the purpose of funding the operations of
7 all branches of the National Government of the Federated States of
8 Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and
9 contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development. The
10 National Government's share of the Amended Compact funds has been
11 reduced to zero; EXCEPT THAT; the National Government will retain
12 the Compact Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent of the
13 Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in the budget
14 for the Department of Education. The sum appropriated herein shall
15 be apportioned as follows:"

16 Section 2. Section 2 of Public Law No. 22-42 is hereby
17 amended to read as follows:

18 "Section 2. Operating Expenses of the Executive Branch.

1 The sum of \$26,621,035, or so much thereof as may be
2 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of
3 the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year
4 ending September 30, 2022, for the purpose of funding the
5 operations of the Executive Branch of the National
6 Government during the fiscal year 2022. The sum
7 appropriated by this section shall be apportioned as
