A RESOLUTION

Requesting that the Speaker of the Twenty-Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia establish a Special Committee on Climate Change and Environmental Issues.

- 1 WHEREAS, in 2016, the United Nation's then Secretary-General
- 2 Ban Ki-moon advised a Pacific Islands Forum meeting that "Pacific
- 3 island nations have a crucial role to play in efforts to advance a
- 4 sustainable future" and that they are "located on the frontlines
- 5 of climate change"; and
- 6 WHEREAS, in addition to its duties related to all other areas
- 7 of the economy of the Federated States of Micronesia, the
- 8 Committee on Resources and Development must also oversee
- 9 fisheries, which make an important contribution to the Nation's
- 10 gross domestic product, exports, and government revenue; and
- 11 WHEREAS, the issues related to climate change and the
- 12 environment at the national and international levels are both
- 13 urgent and complex; and
- 14 WHEREAS, a Special Committee on Climate Change and
- 15 Environmental Issues was established in the Nineteenth, Twentieth,
- 16 Twenty-First and Twenty-Second Congress of the Federated States of
- 17 Micronesia in recognition of the importance and urgency of these
- 18 issues; now, therefore,
- 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Twenty-Third Congress of the Federated
- 20 States of Micronesia, First Regular Session, 2023, that Congress
- 21 hereby requests that the Speaker establish a Special Committee on
