## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To create a National Disaster Relief Fund and to provide for the administration thereof, to supplement funds which may be provided under Public Law No. 7-38, and for other purposes.

	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:
1	Section 1. Findings and declarations.
2	(1) The Congress hereby finds that:
3	(a) Public Law No. 7-38, known as the Trust Territory
4	Disaster Relief Act of 1977, enacted by the Seventh Congress of Micronesia
5	in 1977, established a disaster relief program administered by the High
6	Commissioner of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands; and that
7	(b) The Trust Territory-wide disaster control
8	responsibilities of the High Commissioner are retained by the Trust
9	Territory Government for the duration of the Trusteeship; and that
10	(c) A duty and function of the Office of Planning and
11	Statistics of the Federated States of Micronesia is to propose disaster
12	prevention and disaster relief plans, including provision for the
13	coordination of aid received for the purpose of disaster control; and that
14	(d) Sums have been received by the Federated States of
15	Micronesia Government for the purpose of disaster relief; and that
16	(e) No appropriate disaster relief fund for the
17	Federated States of Micronesia now exists; and that
18	(f) No appropriate provisions for the administration
19	and expenditure of Federated States of Micronesia disaster relief funds
20	now exist; and that
21	(g) Natural disasters and emergencies often disrupt the
22	normal functioning of governments and communities, and adversely affect
23	individuals and families with great severity; and that
24.	(h) Natural disasters and emergencies often cause loss of
25	life, human suffering, loss of income, and property loss and damage; and that

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1 (i) Special measures, in addition to those provided

- 2 pursuant to the Trust Territory Disaster Relief Act of 1977, designed to
- 3 assist the efforts of the affected States in expediting the rendering of
- 4 aid, assistance, and emergency services, and the reconstruction and
- 5 rehabilitation of devastated areas, are desirable and necessary.
- 6 (2) It is therefore declared to be the intent of the Congress to:
- 7 (a) Supplement, but not eliminate or replace, the disaster
- 8 assistance provided to the Federated States of Micronesia by the Trust
- 9 Territory Government pursuant to the terms and provisions of the Trust
- 10 Territory Disaster Relief Act of 1977; and to
- 11 (b) Provide an orderly and continuing means of assistance
- 12 by the Federated States of Micronesia National Government to State and
- 13 local governments in carrying out their responsibilities to alleviate the
- 14 suffering and damage which result from natural disasters and emergencies.
- 15 Section 2. Creation of Disaster Relief Fund.
- 16 (1) There is hereby created a Disaster Relief Fund to be used
- 17 for natural disaster and emergency relief throughout the Federated States
- 18 of Micronesia.
- 19 (2) Monies for the Disaster Relief Fund shall be derived from
- 20 appropriations by the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia and
- 21 the State legislatures, United States grants, funds designated for such
- 22 purposes from international organizations, and from any and all other
- 23 appropriate sources.
- 24 (3) The Disaster Relief Fund shall be administered in
- 25 accordance with the provisions of this act.

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Section 3. <u>Definitions</u>.

- 2 (1) "Emergency" means any hurricane, typhoon, cyclone, tornado,
- 3 storm, flood, high water, wind-driven water, tidal wave, tsunami,
- 4 earthquake, volcanic eruption, landslide, mudslide, drought, fire,
- 5 explosion, civil disturbance, or other catastrophe in any part of the
- 6 Federated States of Micronesia which requires National emergency assistance
- 7 to supplement State and local efforts to save lives and protect property,
- 8 provide for public health and safety or to avert or lessen the threat of
- 9 disaster;
- 10 (2) "Disaster" means any hurricane, typhoon, cyclone, tornado,
- 11 storm, flood, high water, wind-driven water, tidal wave, tsunami, earthquake,
- 12 volcanic eruption, landslide, mudslide, drought, fire explosion, civil
- 13 disturbance, or other catastrophe in any part of the Federated States of
- 14 Micronesia which, in the determination of the President, causes damages of
- 15 sufficient severity and magnitude to warrant disaster assistance under this
- 16 act, above and beyond emergency services by the National Government, to
- 17 supplement the efforts and available resources of States, local governments,
- 18 and disaster relief organizations in alleviating the damage, loss, hardship,
- 19 or suffering caused thereby.
- 20 Section 4. Procedures.
- 21 (1) All requests for a determination by the President that an
- 22 emergency or disaster exists shall be made by the Governor of the affected
- 23 State. Such request shall be based upon the Governor's finding that the
- 24 situation is of such severity and magnitude that effective response is
- 25 beyond the capabilities of the State and the affected local governments

1 and that National assistance is necessary. The Governor's request will

- 2 furnish information describing State and local efforts and resources
- 3 which have been or will be used to alleviate the emergency or disaster,
- 4 and will define the type and extent of National aid required. As a
- 5 prerequisite to emergency or disaster assistance under this act, the
- 6 Governor shall take appropriate action under State law and direct
- 7 execution of any State emergency or disaster plan. Based upon such
- 8 Governor's request, the President may find and declare that a disaster
- 9 or an emergency exists;
- 10 (2) The President may make an independent determination of
- 11 the existence of an emergency or disaster in the event the Governor of
- 12 an affected State for any reason is unable or unwilling to make a request
- 13 for assistance pursuant to the provisions of this act.
- 14 Section 5. Coordinating officers.
- 15 (1) Immediately upon his finding that an emergency exists, or
- 16 his declaration of a disaster, the President may appoint a National
- 17 coordinating officer to operate in the affected area;
- 18 (2) In order to effectuate the purposes of this act, the
- 19 National coordinating officer, if any, within the affected area, shall;
- 20 (a) Make an initial appraisal of the types of relief most
- 21 urgently needed;
- 22 (b) Establish such field offices as he deems necessary and
- 23 as are authorized by the President;
- 24 (c) Assist in the coordination and administration of
- 25 relief, including the activities of State and local governments, the Trust

1 Territory Government, and any disaster relief organizations operating in

2 the affected area; and

- 3 (d) Take such other action, consistent with the provisions
- 4 of this act, as he may deem necessary to assist local citizens and public
- 5 officials in promptly obtaining assistance to which they are entitled.
- 6 Section 6. <u>Use of Disaster Relief Fund monies</u>.
- 7 (1) Expenditures from the Disaster Relief Fund may be used for
- 8 necessary food, clothing, shelter, medical supplies, compensation for
- 9 crop damage, transportation, debris clearance, reconstruction or repair
- 10 of seawalls and other property damage, building materials, administrative
- 11 costs (not to exceed 15 percent of relief provided) and such other matters
- 12 as the President determines to be necessary and occasioned by an emergency
- 13 or disaster as defined by this act;
- 14 (2) Disaster Relief Fund monies shall be administered and
- 15 expended by the National revenue officer in the affected State, except
- 16 in the State of Ponape. In the State of Ponape, Disaster Relief Fund
- 17 monies shall be administered and expended by the Secretary of the Department
- 18 of Finance, or his designee.
- 19 Section 7. Use of local firms and individuals. In the expenditure
- 20 of National funds for debris clearance, distribution of supplies,
- 21 reconstruction, and other emergency or disaster assistance activities
- 22 which may be carried out by contract or agreement with private organizations,
- 23 firms, or individuals, preference shall be given, to the extent feasible
- 24 and practicable to those organizations, firms, and individuals residing
- 25 or doing business primarily in the area affected by such emergency or

2	Section 8. Authority to make expenditures. Upon compliance with
3	the requirements of this act, the President may authorize such expenditures
4	of monies from the Disaster Relief Fund as in his opinion is necessary
5	to carry out the purposes of this act.
6	Section 9. Effective date. This act shall become law upon approval
7	by the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
8	becoming law without such approval.
