## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To establish a health care certificate of need program in accordance with the needs of the people of the Federated States of Micronesia; to repeal chapter 3 of title 41 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- Section 1. Short title. This chapter may be cited as the 1
- "Federated States of Micronesia Health Care Certificate of Need
- Act of 1982."
- Section 2. Purpose.
- The people of the Federated States of Micronesia
- are dependent upon the existence of an efficient, effective, and
- well coordinated program of health care services and disease
- prevention activities. In order to achieve the necessary level of
- efficiency, effectiveness, and coordination, there is a continuous
- compelling need for a rational program for the determination of 10
- allocations of scarce health resources. 1.1
- (2) In addition, the impending termination of the 12
- Trusteeship Agreement and the probable change in resources 13
- available for the delivery of health care and environmental 1.4
- protection require a careful analysis of the proposed allocation 15
- of funds and resources to be used to provide health care, related
- services, and environmental health protection services to ensure 1.7
- that those funds and resources shall be utilized in accordance 1.8
- with the needs of the people of the Federated States of 19
- Micronesia. 20
- (3) Therefore, it is declared to be the public policy 21
- of the Federated States of Micronesia and the purpose of this 22
- chapter to develop and operate a program which will identify the
- health needs of the residents of the Federated States of Micro-
- 25 nesia and ensure that resources which are proposed for health

- 1 programs or services meet those needs in the most efficient and
- 2 effective manner possible.
- 3 (4) It is not the intent of this chapter to prohibit or
- 4 in any way curtail the development of private practice of medicine
- 5 in the Federated States of Micronesia.
- 6 Section 3. Definitions. As used in this chapter unless the
- 7 context otherwise requires:
- 3 (1) "Affected persons" shall include: the applicant,
- 9 the Subarea Health Council, persons residing in the geographic
- 10 area to be served by the applicant, any person who regularly uses
- 11 health services or facilities within the area to be served by the
- 12 proposed project, health care facilities and health maintenance
- 13 organizations located in the service area-which provide similar
- 14 services to those under review, health care facilities and health
- 15 maintenance organizations which have previously indicated their
- 16 insention to provide similar services in the future, third party
- 17 payers who reimburse health care facilities in the service area,
- 18 and rate review organizations in the service area.
- 19 (2) "Agency" means the Trust Territory Office of Health
- 20 Services in its designated copacity as the Micronesia Health
- 21 Planning and Davelopment Agency which was created by designation
- 22 agreement between the High Commissioner and the United States
- 23 Secretary of Realth, Education, and Welfare as the Trust
- 24 Territory's designated agency to administer territorial health
- 25 planning and development functions. The team "Micronesia Health

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- I Flanning and Davelopment Agency" in further defined to be
- 2 synonymous with the terms "Territorial Health Planning and
- 3 Development Agency," "State Health Planning and Development
- 4 Agency," and "Office of Health Planning and Development." These
- 5 terms may be used interchangeably to mean the same in this chapter
- 6 or in the regulations adopted under this chapter.
- 7 (3) "Certificate of need" means an authorization, when
- 8 required under this chapter, to construct, expand, alter, or
- 9 convert a health care facility or to initiate, expand, or modify a
- 10 -health care service, or to acquire major medical equipment.
- 11 (4) "Cost" for the purposes of determining whether a
- 12 proposed project is subject to review mander this chapter means
- 13 the fair market value or the amount actually paid to acquire a
- 14 facility or equipment or to initiate a service, whichever is
- 15 higher.
- 16 (5) "Date activity undertaken" means the date on which
- 17 institutional health services are actually started.
- 13 (6) "Director" means the director of the Trust
- 19 Territory Office of Health Services in his capacity as the
- 20 director of the Micronesia Health Planning and Development Agency.
- 21 (7) "Health care facilities" means, hospitals,
- 22 psychiatric hospitals, tuberculosis hospitals, skilled nursing
- 23 facilities, kidney disease treatment centers including
- 24 freestanding hemodialysis units, intermediate care facilities,
- 25 ambulatory surgical facilities, and such other facilities as the

- 3 Section 4. Program established. There is established the
- 4 Federated States of Micronesia Centificate of Need Program which
- 5 shall prescribe the means, procedures, and requirements for health
- 6 care providers to apply for and obtain certificates of need prior
- 7 to undertaking construction, expansion, alteration, or conversion
- 8 of health care facilities or initiation, expansion, or
- 9 modification of certain health care services including acquisition
- 10 of equipment.
- 11 Section 5. Coverage; Applicability.
- 12 . (1) Commencing on the effective date of this chapter,
- 13 no person, whether public or private, -shall make capital
- 14 expenditures for activities enumerated in subsection (2) of this
- 15 section without first obtaining a certificate of need or an
- 16 exemption as required under this chapter.
- 17 (2) A certificate of need shall be required prior to:
- 18 (a) The development of all new institutional
- 19 health services including, but not limited to, the construction,
- 20 development, or other establishment of any new health facility;
- 21 (b) Any obligation for a capital expenditure by or-
- 22 on behalf of a health care facility, other than to acquire an
- 23 existing health care facility, in excess of \$50,000, including the
- 24 costs of surveys, designs, plans, working drawings,
- 25 specifications, and other accivities essential to the acquisition,

- $oldsymbol{1}$  improvement, expansion, replacement, or construction of any plant
- 2 or equipment;
- (c) The offering by a health care facility of
- 4 health services which were not offered on a regular basis in or
- 5 through such health care facility within the 12-month period
- 6 proceeding the time such services would be offered, if:
- 7 (i) The obligation of any capital expenditure
- 8 is entailed by the addition of services; or
- 9 (ii) Regardless of whether a capital
- 10 expenditure is entailed, the annual operating costs for such .
- 11 services will exceed \$10,000.
- 12 (d) The termination of a health service which was
- 13 offered in or through a health care facility if that termination
- 14 is associated with obligation of any capital expenditures.
- 15 (a) The obligation of any capital expenditure by
- 16 or on behalf of a health care facility which changes the bed
- 17 capacity of a health care facility by increasing or decreasing the
- 18 rotal number of beds (or distributing beds among various
- 19 categories of relocating such beds from one physical facility on
- 20 size to another) by 10 beds or 10 percent of total bed capacity,
- 21 whichever is less, over a 2-year period;
- 22 (f) The acquisition by any person of major medical
- 23 equipment to be owned by or located in a health care facility or,
- 24 regardless of ownership or location, if the equipment is to be
- 25 used to provide patient care services, to impatients or

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- 1 outpatients, unless such services are provided on an occasional
- 2 basis in the event of natural disaster, major accident, or
- 3 equipment Tailure;
- 4 (g) If any person acquires an existing health care
- 5 facility, that person shall file a notice of intent with the
- 6 Agency as prescribed under section 6 of this chapter. A
- 7 certificate of need shall be required for such acquisition unless
- 8 the Agency finds that the acquirer is a health maintenance
- 9 organization; or that no changes will result in facilities or
- 10 services rendered due to the acquisition;
- II (h) In the event that the Agency issues a
- 12 certificate of need for a project and within one year of the date
- 13 the project was undertaken there is a change in that project
- 14 associated with a capital expenditure, regardless of the amount of
- 15 the expenditure, that change will be subject to certificate of
- 16 need review.
- 17 (3) A certificate of need which normally would be
- 18 required under subsection (2) of this section will not be required
- 19 if:
- 20 (a) A health care facility is being acquired by a
- 21 health maintenance organization or if the acquisition will not
- 22 result in a change of services or modification of the facility,
- 23 including the organizational structure;
- (b) The applicant is a health maintenance
- 25 organization if:

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1	(i) It has a current enrollment or
2	reasonable anticipated future enrollment of at least 50,000
3	persons in the service area;
4	(ii) The proposed facility or service will be
5	reasonably accessible to the enrolled population;
6	(iii) At least 75 percent of the persons to be
7	served will be enrollees; and
8	(iv) An acquisition of a facility or
9	equipment is by lease, the lease will be in effect for at least 15
10	years duration after such acquisition.
11	(c) Major medical equipment is acquired by or on
12	hehalf of a clinical laboratory to provide clinical laboratory
13	services, if:
14	(i) The clinical laboratory is independent
15	of a physician's office and a hospital; and
16	(ii) It is determined under title XVIII of
17	the United States Social Security Act to meet the requirements of
18	paragraphs (10) and (11) of 1861(s) of that act.
19	(4) The Agency must issue a certificate of need for a
20	capital expenditure necessary to:
21	(a) Eliminate or prevent a safety hazard;
22	(b) Comply with licensure standards; or
23	(c) Comply with accreditation or certification
24	standards required for the applicant to receive reimbursement
25	under title XVIII or XIX of the United States Social Security Act;

1	PROVIDED that prior to issuance of such a certificate of need the
2.	Agency finds that:
3	(i) The facility or service for which the
4	capital expenditure is proposed is needed; and
5	(ii) The obligation of the capital
6	expenditure is consistent with the State health plan.
· 7	(5) For capital expenditures not meeting the criteria
8	set forth in subsection (4) of this section, the Agency shall
9	issue a certificate of need, if it is found that:
1.0	(i) The proposed facility, services, or
11	equipment is needed by the population to be served;
12	(ii) Such facility, service, or
13	equipment is consistent with the Trust Territory health plan; and
14	(iii) The project complies with this
15	chapter and regulations adopted under this chapter. The criteria
16	to be used by the Agency in determining need for the facility.
17	service, or equipment shall be as set forth in section 7 of this
18	chapter.
19	Section 6. Applications.
20	(i) Applications for certificates of need and notices
21 ·	of intent shall be filed with the Agency on application forms
22	provided by the Agency and shall contain such information and be
23	in such ferm as the director may require.
24.	(2) At least 30 days before any person acquires or
25	enters into a contract to acquire an existing health cave facility

l or major addical equipment which will not be located in or owned

- 2 by a boulth care facility, the person shall notify the Agency of
- 3 the intended acquisition. Such notice of intent shall be in
- 4 writing, containing such information as required by regulations as
- 5 the Agency may promulgate.
- 6 (%) The Agency shall act upon any application submitted
- 7 pursuent to this chapter within 90 days of receipt of such
- 8 application; PROVIDED that for reasonable cause and upon notice to
- 9 the applicant, the Agency may extend its time for review for a
- 10 specific period not to exceed 30 additional days. In cases where

- 24 Section 7. Review criteria. The Agency shall adopt
- 25 regulations under this chapter which shall prescribe specific/

- 4 according to the purpose for which a particular review is being

- 6 . (6) The relationship of the services proposed to be
- 7 provided to the existing health care system of the area in which
- 8 such sarvices are proposed to be provided and the probable impact
- 9 of the proposal on the economic and social development of the
- 10 Federated States of Micronesia;
- (1) The contribution of the proposed service or
- 12 facility to meeting the health needs of medically underserved
- 13 groups which have traditionally experienced difficulties in
- 14 obtaining equal access to health services, particularly those

6	Section 8. <u>Withdrawal</u> . The Agency may withdraw a
.7	certificate of need if:
3	(1) The applications contain false or misleading
9	information or intentionally omits material facts; or
10	(2) Circumstances based upon which the certificates of
11 <sup>,</sup> '	·
12	which alter the need for the projects; PROVIDED that said changed
13	or new circumstances occur prior to the commencement of
14	construction or substantial expenditure or obligation of funds.
15	(3) All applications for a certificate of need shall
16	include a timetable for implementing the project. The Agency
17	shall periodically evaluate the progress of the applicant towards
18	implementing the project according to the timetable submitted.
19 -	Failure or the applicant to make a good faith effort toward
20	implementation may constitute grounds for withdrawal of the
21	certificate of need.
22	(4) Any holder of a certificate of need shall be
23	entitled to an administrative hearing prior to the suspension of
24	its certificate of need.

1	(1) The Agency shall order a public hearing on an
2	application upon written request by any person for the purposes of
3	reconsidering an Agency decision, PROVIDED that:
4	(a) The request is received within 30 days
5	after the decision was rendered; and
6	(b) A good cause is shown. A request for
7	public hearing shall be deemed to have shown good cause if it:
8	(i) Presents significant relevant
9	information not previously considered by the Agency;
10	(ii) Demonstrates that there have been
L1 .	significant changes in factors or circumstances relied upon by the
L2	Agency in making its decision;
L3	(iii) Demonstrates that the Agency failed to
L4	follow appropriate procedures prescribed in these regulations; or

1.1	Section 10. Judicial review.
.2	(1) Any person adversely affected by a final decision
3	of the Agency with respect to a certificate of need or an
4	application for exemption may, within a Teasonable time after the
5	decision is made, obtain judicial review in accordance with title

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- 1 17 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia.
- 2 (2) The court shall affirm the decision of the Agency
- 3 unless it finds it to be arbitrary or capricious or not made in
- 4 compliance with applicable law;
- 5 (3) For the purposes of this section, "person adversely
- 6 affected" shall include the Agency, any person previously defined
- 7 as "affected" in section 3 of this chapter, and any person who
- 8 participated in the review proceedings before the Agency.
- 9 Section 11. Nontransferability. A certificate of need
- 10 issued under this chapter is not transferable without the prior
- 11 written approval of the Agency.
- 12 . Section 12. Civil penalties. Any person violating any of
- 13 the provisions of section 5 of this chapter shall be subject to the
- 14 imposition of a civil fine in the amount of \$500 for each
- 15 violation; PROVIDED that for the purpose of determining the amount
- 16 of fine to be imposed under this chapter, violations shall be
- 17 deemed recurring with each week or fractional part thereof that a
- 18 violation continues being construed as a separate violation.
- 19 Section 13. Reporting. The director shall submit an annual
- 20 report to the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia on or
- 21 before January 10 of each year on all activities of the Agency and
- 22 all funds received by the Agency pursuant to, or by virtue of this
- 23 chapter.
- 24 Section 14. Regulations Promulgation.
- 25 (1) The Agency shall adopt and promulgate the

1	regulations authorized in section 7 of this chapter in accordance
2	with the procedures and requirements of the Federated States of
- 3	Micronesia Administrative Procedures Act, title 17 of the Code of
4	the Federated States of Micronesia, except that compliance by the
5	Agency with the requirements of subsection (2) of this section
6	shall constitute compliance with all the publication and notice
7	requirements set forth in title 17 of the Code of the Federated
8	States of Micronesia and further that notwithstanding the

21 '	opportunity to offer written comments on the review procedures
22	proposed for adoption;
23	(ii) Distribute copies of its proposed,
24	adopted and revised or amended review procedures to public and
25	private health organizations, the Micronesia Health Coordinating

- 1 Council, the Governors of the Federated States of Micronesia, the
- 2 High Commissioner, the Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare,
- 3 the President of the Federated States of Micronesia, and such
- 4 other interested persons as shall request them; including rate
- 5 setting agencies and health maintenance organizations should such
- 6 be established within the Federated States of Micronesia; and
- 7 (iii) The Agency shall notify the general
- 8 public of its intent to adopt procedures and criteria, or
- 9 revisions thereof, through publication in at least one newspaper
- 10 of general corculation in the Federated States of Micronesia.
- 11 (3) The Agency shall file in the Office of the
- 12 Registrar of Corporations of the National Government of the
- 13 Federated States of Micronesia, the office of each State Governor,
- 14 and with the Clerks of Court of both the State and National Courts
- 15 and the Trust Territory High Court, a certified copy of the review
- 16 procedure regulation adopted by it.
- 17 (4) Each regulation adopted is effective 10 days after
- 18 completion of the requirements of subsection (2) of this section.
- 19 (5) The regulations adopted and promulgated by the
- 20 Agency in July of 1979 in accordance with the act are hereby
- 21 confirmed and shall remain in effect until amended, repealed, or
- 22 superseded by the Agency acting pursuant to and in accordance with
- 23 this charter.
- 24 Section 15. Rights and liabilities unaffected. The repeal
- 25 in section 16 of this act does not affect the status of any civil

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1	or criminal actions, rights, or liabilities existing before the
2	repeal takes effect.
3	Section 16. Repealer. Chapter 3 of title 41 of the Code of
4	the Federated States of Micronesia is hereby repealed in its
5	entirery.
6	Section 17. Effective date. This act shall become law upon
7	approval by the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or
8	upon its becoming law without such approval.
