A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 408 and 412 of title 24 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia to require certification that persons on foreign vessels fishing within the jurisdiction of the Federated States of Micronesia are free from communicable disease, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONCRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESTA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 408 of title 24 of the Code of the Federated
- 2. States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 3 "Section 408. Fishing permits and health certification required.
 - (1) No foreign fishing vessel shall engage in fishing regulated pursuant to the provisions of this title in the extended fishery zone of Micronesia unless such vessel has on board a valid permit issued under this section and sections 409 through 414 for such vessel. No foreign fishing vessel shall engage in fishing in the Territorial Sea or the exclusive fishery zone of a State unless such vessel has on board a valid permit issued by the State for such vessel/ and a valid unexpired medical certificate issued pursuant to subsection (2) below for each and every person on board a ship;
 - (2) Upon first entering the Territorial Sea pursuant to a foreign fishing agreement or a permit issued pursuant to section 412 below, the owner of any foreign fishing vessel or the owners' agents shall ensure that the vessel proceed to the nearest port of entry designated under title 18 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia. Upon arrival at the port of entry, the owners thereof, or their agents, shall ensure that each and every person on board is forthwith given a physical examination by a medical doctor licensed in the Federated States of Micronesia in accordance with the requirements established by the Authority. The medical doctor shall state on forms prescribed by the Authority, his or her conclusion as to
