A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend title 20 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia by amending sections 101, 102, 103, 108, 109, 110, 111, and 112, by repealing sections 104, 105, 106, and 107, and by adding new sections 109 and 110 to revise the Civil Aviation laws of the Federated States of Micronesia, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1	Section 1. Section 101 of title 20 of the Code of the Federated
2	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
3	"Section 101. Definitions. As used in this chapter,
4	unless the context otherwise requires:
5	(1) 'Aeronautics' means the science and art of flight
6	(2) 'Aircraft' means any contrivance now known or
7	hereafter invented, used, or designed for navigation of or
8	flight in the air.
9	(3) 'Airport' means any area of land or water which
10	is used or intended for use for the landing and takeoff of
ι1	aircraft, and any appurtenant areas which are used or
12	intended for use for airport buildings or other airport
13	facilities or rights of way, including approaches, together
L 4	with all airport buildings and facilities located thereon.
15	(4) 'Department' means the Department of
16	Transportation and Communications of the Trust Tettitory
۱7	Federated States of Micronesia.
18	(5) 'F.S.M.' means Federated States of Micronesia.
19	(86) 'Director Secretary' means the director Secretary
20	of the Department of Transportation and Communications of
21	the Trust Territory Federated States of Micronesia or his
22	designee.

24	Section 2. Section 102 of title 20 of the Code of the Federated

25 States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:

1	"Section 102. Supervision and development of aeronautics -
2	General.
3	(1) The department shall have general supervision
4	over aeronautics within the Trust Territory Federated
5	States of Micronesia. It shall encourage, foster, and
6	assist in the development of aeronautics in the Trust
7	Territory Federated States of Micronesia and encourage the
8	establishment of airports and air navigation facilities in
9	appropriate areas.
10	(2) The department shall cooperate with and assist
11	agencies of the United States Government, district State
12	governments, and other agencies, parties, or persons in the
13	development of aeronautics, and shall seek to coordinate
14	the aeronautical activities of the Trust Territory
15	Federated States of Micronesia with appropriate agencies of
16	the United States Government in accordance with the terms
17	of the Compact of Free Association and subsidiary
18	agreements thereto.
19	(3) District State governments of the Trust Territory
20	Federated States of Micronesia shall cooperate with the
21	department in the development of aeronautics and aeronautic
22	facilities."
23	Section 3. Section 103 of title 20 of the Code of the Federated
24	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
25	"Section 103. Administration of airports and facilities.

1	The department shall be responsible for and have the
2	authority to regulate the administration of airports and
3	ait nayigational facilities in the Trust Tetritory
4	international and interstate civil aviation in the
5	Federated States of Micronesia including:
6	(I) the planning, acquisition, establishment,
7	enlatgenent, and improvement of airports, airport
8	facilities, and ait navigational facilities;
9	(21) the establishment of policies, rules, and
10	regulations for air traffic safety, operations, and control
11	(32) the protection of airports and aircraft against
12	hazards;
13	(4) the establishment of landing and use fees for
14	áit pót tá (
15	(\$3) the establishment of a system of airport and
16	aircraft inspection;
17	(84) the establishment of criteria for airport
18	personnel, aircraft crews, and maintenance personnel
19	requiring appropriate training and tests;
20	(75) the establishment of rules and regulations

24	(97) the establishment of reasonable fees for services
25	rendered pursuant to this chapter."

1	Section 4. Sections 104, 105, 106 and 107 of title 20 of the
2	Code of the Federated States of Micronesia are hereby repealed in
3	their entirety.
4	Section 5. Section 108 of title 20 of the Code of the Federated
5	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
6	"Section 108104. Federal aid. The department may accept,
7	receive, disburse, and expend moneys from the United States
8	Government and other moneys, public or private, made
9	available by grant or loan to accomplish, in whole or in
10	part, any of the purposes of this act. Such moneys shall
11	be managed in accordance with title 55 of the Code of the
12	Federated States of Micronesia. All moneys from the United
13	States Government accepted under and pursuant to this
14	chapter shall be accepted and expended by the department
15	upon such terms and conditions as are prescribed by the
16	United States Government, and the department may enter into
17	any contracts which may be required in connection
18	thetewith/"
19	Section 6. Section 109 of title 20 of the Code of the Federated
20	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
21	"Section 109105. United States-Tyust/Territory Federated
22	States of Micronesia joint heavings and reciprocal services.
23	(1) Joint Weatings! In accordance with the Compact
24	of Free Association and subsidiary agreements thereto Tthe
25	department may confer with of hold joint heatings with any

1	agency of the United States Government in connection with
2	any matter arising under this chapter or relating to the
3	sound development of aeronautics.
4	[2] Réciptocal sétyicés! The dépatinent nay avail
5	itself of the cooperation, services, records, and
6	facilities of the agencies of the United States Government
7	as fully as may be practicable in the administration and
8	enforcement of this chapter. The/department shall furnish
9	to the agencies of the United States Government its

11	may be practicable."
12	Section 7. Section 110 of title 20 of the Code of the Federated
13	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
14	"Section 110106. Accidents involving aircraft.
15	(1) It shall be the duty of the director Secretary to:
16	(a) make rules and regulations governing
17	notification and report of accidents involving aircraft/
18	subject to section 120 of this chapter;
19	(b) investigate such accidents and prepare
20	records of the facts, conditions, and circumstances
21	relating to each accident and the probable cause thereof,
22	and, in carrying out his duties under this section, the
23	diféttof Secretary is authorized to examine and test to the
24	extent necessary any aircraft, aircraft engine, propeller,
25	appliance, or property aboard an aircraft involved in an

1	accident; and
2	(c) take necessary steps that will tend to
3	prevent similar accidents in the future. $^{\frac{4}{2}}$
4	(2) In conducting any investigation as provided in
5	this section, the director Secretary may seek assistance
6	from the appropriate agency of the United States Government
7	and may make available to such agency his records and any
8	parts of any aircraft involved in an accident."
9	Section 8. Section 111 of title 20 of the Code of the Federated
10	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
11	"Section 111107. Enforcement of aeronautical laws. The
12	director Secretary, officers, and employees of the
13	department, and every police officer charged with the
14	enforcement of laws in the Trust Tetritory Federated States
15	of Micronesia, shall enforce and assist in the enforcement
16	of this chapter and of all rules, regulations, and orders
17	issued pursuant thereto, and of all other laws of the
18	Trust Territory Federated States of Micronesia relating to
19	aeronautics, and, in that capacity, may inspect and examine
20	at reasonable hours any premises and the buildings and
21	other structures thereon where airports, air navigation
22	facilities, or other aeronautical activities are operated
23	or conducted."
24	Section 9. Section 112 of title 20 of the Code of the Federated
25	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 112108. Rules, regulations, and standards.

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(1) The director Secretary may perform acts, issue and amend orders, make, promulgate, and amend reasonable rules, regulations, and procedures, and establish minimum standards consistent with this chapter as he deems necessary to carry out the provisions of this chapter. director Secretary is to perform his duties under this chapter commensurate with and for the purpose of protecting and insuring the general public interest and safety, and the safety of persons operating, using, or traveling in aircraft, and the safety of persons and property on land or water, and commensurate with and for the purpose of developing and promoting aeronautics in the Trust Territory Federated States of Micronesia. No thie of tegulation of the director shall apply to airports or air navigation facilities owned or operated by the United States **Goyethment**_L

(2) No thies, tegalations, others, of standards prescribed by the director shall be inconsistent with or contrary to any act of the Congress of the United States, or any tegalations promulgated or standards established pursuant thereto that are applicable to the Trust Terratory.

(32) All rules and regulations having the force and effect of law shall be approved by the Migh Commissioner

President and promulgated in accordance with chapter 2 of

1 title 17 of this code." Section 10. Title 20 of the Code of the Federated States of 2 Micronesia is hereby amended by adding a new section 109 to read as follows: "Section 109. Civil penalties. Any person who violates 5 any provision of this chapter or any rule, regulation, or 6 order issued thereunder, or any term condition, or 7 limitation of any permit or certificate issued under this 8 act, shall be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed 10 \$1,000 for each such violation, except that the amount of civil penalty shall not exceed \$10,000 for each such 11 violation which relates to the transportation of hazardous 12 materials. If such violation is a continuing one, each day 13 of such violation shall constitute a separate offense. 14 15 amount of any such civil penalty which relates to the transportation of hazardous materials shall be assessed by 16 the Secretary, or his delegate, upon written notice upon 17 finding of violation by the Secretary, after notice and an 18 opportunity for a hearing as provided by title 17 of the 19 Code of the Federated States of Micronesia. In determining 20 21 the amount of such penalty, the Secretary shall take into account the nature, circumstances, extent, and gravity of 22 23 the violation committed and, with respect to the person found to have committed such violation, the degree of 24 25 culpability, any history of prior offenses, ability to pay,

1	effect on ability to continue to do business, and such
2	other matters as justice may require."
3	Section 11. Title 20 of the Code of the Federated States of
4	Micronesia is hereby amended by adding a new section 110 to read as
5	follows:
6	"Section 110. Criminal penalties. Any person who
7	knowingly and willfully violates any provision of this act
8	or any order, rule, or regulation issued by the Secretary
9	or any term, condition, or limitation of any certificate or
10	permit issued under this act shall be deemed guilty of a
11	misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be subject
12	for this offense to a fine of not more than \$500, and for
13	any subsequent offense to a fine of not more than \$2,000.
14	If such violation is a continuing one, each day of such
15	violation shall constitute a separate offense."
16	Section 12. This act shall become law upon approval by the
17	President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its becoming
18	law without such approval.
