A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend Public Law No. 6-10 by repealing section 1 and adding a new section 1 for the purpose of modifying the format of appropriations for the executive branch, by amending section 14 for the purpose of modifying the method of counting employees covered under employment ceilings, and by amending section 15 for the purpose of modifying the authority to reprogram funds, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 6-10 is hereby repealed
2 in its entirety and a new section 1 is hereby added to read as
3 follows:

4 "Section 1. Operating expenses of the executive branch.
5 The sum of \$8,662,711, or so much thereof as may be
6 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of
7 the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year
8 ending September 30, 1990, for the operations of the
9 executive branch of the National Government of the
10 Federated States of Micronesia during fiscal year 1990.
11 The sum appropriated by this section shall be apportioned
12 as follows:

10 Section 2. Section 14 of Public Law No. 6-10 is hereby amended
 11 to read as follows:

12 "Section 14. Employment ceilings. Subsection (1) sets
 13 forth the maximum number of positions that may be hired by
 14 branches and agencies of the National Government.

22 (2) The number of positions authorized applies
23 individually to each of the departments and offices of the
24 executive and legislative branches, the National judiciary,
25 the Public Auditor, and to the agencies as provided in

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1 subsection (1) of this section, except that the President
2 may transfer up to 12 positions between the departments and
3 offices of the executive branch. This authorization of
4 positions covers all permanent employees and all contract
5 personnel whose employment extends for ~~more than 90 days~~ 1
6 year or more. No funds may be expended for unbudgeted
7 positions."

8 Section 3. Section 15 of of Public Law No. 6-10 is hereby
9 amended to read as follows:

10 "Section 15. Reprogramming.

11 (1) The President or his designee may reprogram up to
12 10 percent to and from the funds appropriated to each of the
13 ~~paragraphs~~ subsections in section 1. The President or his
14 designee may reprogram up to 15 percent to and from the funds
15 appropriated in ~~any of the subparagraphs within the same~~
16 ~~paragraph of~~ each of the paragraphs within the subsections of
17 section 1.

18 (2) The Speaker or his designee may reprogram up to 10
19 percent to and from the funds appropriated to each of the
20 subsections in section 2, and may reprogram up to 15 percent to
21 and from the funds appropriated in each of the paragraphs within
22 the subsections of section 2.

23 (3) The Chief Justice or his designee may reprogram up to
24 15 percent to and from the funds appropriated in each of the
25 subsections in section 3.

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
1 (4) The Public Auditor may reprogram up to 15 percent to
2 and from the funds appropriated in each of the subsections in
3 section 4.

4 (5) Allottees of funds may reprogram up to 15 percent
5 to and from the funds appropriated in each of the paragraphs
6 within the subsections of section 5.

7 (6) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections (1)
8 through (5) of this section, no funds may be reprogrammed
9 ~~to or~~ from any personnel account or funds appropriated
10 pursuant to subparagraph (e) of subsection (1) of section
11 1, or subparagraphs (b)(v) and (e)(v) of subsection (7) of
12 section 1 of this act."

13 Section 4. This act shall become law upon approval by the
14 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its becoming
15 law without such approval.
