A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$76,055 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1995, for the purpose of paying travel and related costs of the Second FSM Tourism Conference to be held in Pohnpei in November of 1995, for the purpose of retaining a tourism consultant to assist the Department of Resources and Development in implementing the FSM Strategic Plan, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. The sum of \$76,055, or so much thereof as may be
2 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the
3 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending
4 September 30, 1995, for the purpose of paying travel and related
5 costs of the Second FSM Tourism Conference to be held in Pohnpei
6 in November of 1995, and for the purpose of retaining a tourism
7 consultant to assist the Department of Resources and Development
8 in implementing the FSM Strategic Plan. The sum appropriated by
9 this act shall be apportioned as follows:

- 10 (1) Tourism Conference.....\$ 16,055
- 11 (2) Tourism Consultant..... 60,000


12 Section 2. All funds appropriated by this act shall be
13 allotted, managed, administered, and accounted for in accordance
14 with applicable law, including, but not limited to, the
15 Financial Management Act of 1979. The allottee shall be
16 responsible for ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in
18 this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess of the
19 sum appropriated. The authority of the allottee to obligate
20 funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as of September 30,
21 1995.
