A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$112,696 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1996, for the purpose of developing a health plan, leptospirosis control, and health information development, and for other purposes.

BE	IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:
1	Section 1. The sum of \$112,696, or so much thereof as may
2	be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of
3	the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending
4	September 30, 1996 for the purpose of developing a health plan,
5	leptospirosis control, and health information development. The
6	funds appropriated hereby shall be deemed to come from the funds
7	available under section 221(b) of the Compact of Free
8	Association and shall be allocated as follows:
9	(1) Development a health plan\$ 31,500
10	(2) Leptospirosis control 16,165
11	(3) Health information development 65,032
12	Section 2. All funds appropriated by this act shall be
13	allotted, managed, administered, and accounted for in accordance
14	with applicable law, including, but not limited to, the
15	Financial Management Act of 1979. The allottee of the funds
16	appropriated under this act shall be the President of the
17	Federated States of Micronesia or his designee, who shall be
18	responsible for ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as
19	may be necessary, are used solely for the purpose specified in
20	this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess of the
21	sum appropriated. The authority of the allottee to obligate

funds appropriated by this act shall lapse on September 30,
