## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend title 9 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended, by amending section 108, as amended by Public Law No. 5-70, and by amending section 704, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 5-70 and 8-97, and by amending section 705, as amended by Public Law No. 8-97, for the purpose of improving absentee ballot procedures by requiring a person voting through absentee ballots to submit a certified affidavit, requiring return of an absentee ballot to the national election commissioner through mail only, requiring receipt of an absentee ballot by the national election commissioner no later than three days after the day of the election, requiring certification of the affidavit, and invalidating an absentee ballot that does not meet statutory requirements, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 108 of title 9 of the Code of the 2 Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Law No. 5-3 70, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 108. Affidavits to be sworn.

"Section 704. Marking and return of ballot --

14 <u>Voting at polls</u>.

(1) The national election commissioner of each 15 State or the board of election, as the case may be, 16 17 shall, at least 30 days prior to an election, provide to any person who may be entitled to vote by 18 absentee ballot, and who requests the same, an 19 official ballot, a ballot envelope, an affidavit 20 21 prescribed by the national election commissioner, and a covering reply envelope. If a request for an 22 absentee ballot is made 30 days or less prior to an 23 election, the national election commissioner or 2.4

board shall provide the materials to the person making

the request as soon as is practicable. The absentee 1 voter shall mark the ballot in the usual manner · provided by law and in such manner that no person can see 3 how the ballot is marked except as provided in or know section 702 of this title. The absentee voter shall 5 б then deposit the ballot in the envelope and securely seal the same. 8 (2) The absentee voter shall then complete and 9 execute the affidavit in the presence of a notary 10 public licensed to practice in the jurisdiction wherein the affidavit is executed. 9	subsection (2) of section 705 of this title.
10	. $(\cancel{2}4)$ It is unlawful for persons having voted
11	an absentee ballot to cast a ballot at the polls on
12	election day."
13	Section 3. Section 705 of title 9 of the Code of the
14	Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Law No.
15	8-97, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
16	"Section 705. <u>Disposition of ballots</u> .
17	(1) Upon the receipt of the envelope marked
18	'Absentee ballot' enclosed within the period
19	prescribed in section 704 of this title from any
20	person voting under the provisions of this title,
21	the national election commissioner, or his
22	appointee, shall open it, remove the ballot
23	envelope, and examine the statement as to its proper
24	execution, the person's qualifications to register
25	as an elector, and to vote. If the national

1	election commissioner determines that the person is
2	qualified to vote by absentee ballot, the ballot
3	envelope shall be deposited unopened in a container
4	retained for that purpose. The container shall be
5	securely sealed except for an opening sufficient to
6 '	permit deposit of ballot envelopes and shall be
<b>7</b> · .	marked with the name and official title of the
8	National election commissioner or his appointee, and
9	the words, This container holds absentee ballots
10	and must be opened only pursuant to law. The
11	national election commissioner or his appointee
12	shall safely keep each container in his office until
13	the day of election and at such time he shall
14	publicly open the container, extract and segregate
15	the ballot envelopes, and deliver such envelopes to
16	the counting and tabulation committee.
17 .	(2) In case the statement is found to be
18	insufficient or in case the signatures do not
19	correspond, or in case the ballot was not mailed,
20	but delivered to the national election commissioner
21	in any other manner, or in case the ballot was
22	received by the national election commissioner more
23	than three days after the election, or in case the
24	voter has not complied with the other requirements
25	of section 704 of this title or is not a duly

1		qualified elector or the ballot envelope is open or
2	28.2	has been opened and resealed, the ballot envelope
. 3		shall not be opened and the national election
4		commissioner or his appointee shall mark across its
5		face Rejected, giving the reason therefor, and
6		shall preserve the same in the manner provided by
7		law.
8		(3) If the ballot is received after the time fixed
9		in section 704 of this title, the ballot envelope
10		shall be endorsed by the national election
11		commissioner or his appointee for the period of tim
12		required for the preservation of ballots used at
13	×	such election, and shall then, without being opened
14		be destroyed in accordance with applicable law.
15		(4) If upon receiving the ballot envelope from the
16		national election commissioner or his appointee it
17		is found that the voter has already voted, the
18		election inspectors shall immediately cancel the
19	a)	ballot envelope and write Rejected across its face,
20		giving the reason therefor, and shall preserve
