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A RESOLUTION

To ratify the "Agreement for the Implementation of the Provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 Relating to the Conservation and Management of Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks."

1	WHEREAS, the "Agreement for the Implementation of the Provisions of the
2	United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December 1982 Relating
3	to the Conservation and Management of Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly
4	Migratory Fish Stocks" (the "High Seas Agreement") was opened for signature at
5	the United Nations in New York on December 4, 1995, and the Federated States
6	of Micronesia became a signatory to the Agreement at that time; and
7	WHEREAS, the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia has
8	acceded to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 October
9	1982 ("UNCLOS") and the High Seas Agreement is an agreement for the
10	implementation of provisions of UNCLOS relating to the conservation and
11	management of straddling fish stocks and highly migratory fish stocks; and
12	WHEREAS, straddling fish stocks maintain their habitats both in exclusive
13	economic zones and the high seas, and highly migratory fish stocks migrate in
14	and out of exclusive economic zones and the high seas; and
15	WHEREAS, the high seas have been viewed as a "global commons" and
16	have been unregulated prior to the High Seas Agreement; and
17	WHEREAS, the FSM has actively participated in the United Nations
18	Conferences on the High Seas Agreement in conjunction with other small island
19	states and has worked hard to obtain an agreement that is acceptable to the
20	FSM; and
21	WHEREAS, the High Seas Agreement establishes conservation and
22	management measures using the precautionary approach for straddling fish

1 WHEREAS, the High Seas Agreement establishes conservation

- 2 and management measures using the precautionary approach for
- 3 straddling fish stocks and highly migratory fish stock to:
- 4 eliminate over-fishing and excess fishing capacity; promote and
- 5 conduct scientific research; effectively perform monitoring,
- 6 control and surveillance; promote and develop the use of safe
- 7 and cost-effective fishing gear and techniques; protect
- 8 biodiversity; and protect dependent species; and
- 9 WHEREAS, certain highly migratory fish stocks and straddling
- 10 fish stocks, particularly tuna and tuna-like species, are among
- 11 the most important resources of the FSM, and the FSM will
- 12 benefit from international conservation and management efforts
- 13 on behalf of such stocks; and
- 14 WHEREAS, under the High Seas Agreement, regional fisheries
- 15 management organizations will be established for cooperation in
- 16 conservation and management measures, including: allocation of
- 17 catch; adoption of international minimum standards for
- 18 responsible fishing; adoption of mechanisms to obtain scientific
- 19 advice, review stock status, and assess impact on non-target and
- 20 ecologically related species; standards for data collection and
- 21 dissemination, and other measures; and
- 22 WHEREAS, the responsibilities of flag state vessels are
- 23 clarified, including compliance and enforcement measures for
- 24 fishing violations; and
- WHEREAS, boarding and inspection procedures for port states

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1	for vessels apprehended on the high seas are established; and
2	WHEREAS, the special requirements of developing States are
3	recognized and assistance made available for fisheries
4	conservation, management and development; and
5	WHEREAS, mechanisms for peaceful settlements of disputes are
6	established; now, therefore,
7	BE IT RESOLVED by the Ninth Congress of the Federated States
8	of Micronesia, Third Regular Session, 1996, that pursuant to
9	section 2(b) of article IX of the Constitution of the Federated
10	States of Micronesia, the Congress hereby ratifies the "High Sea
11	Agreement"; and
12	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon receipt of this resolution,
13	the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or the
14	Secretary of External Affairs shall lodge with the Secretary-
15	General of the United Nations as depository, an instrument of
16	ratification; and
17	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
18	resolution be transmitted to the President of the Federated
19	States of Micronesia.
