A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend [section 2] sections 2, 3 and 5 of Public Law No. 17-68, as amended by [Public Law No. 17-71] Public Law No. 17-71, 17-81, 17-84 and 17-89], for the purpose of changing the use and allottee of certain funds previously appropriated to fund public projects and social programs in the States of Yap and Kosrae, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

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date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be 1 2 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in accordance with applicable laws, including, but not 3 4 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The 5 allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used 6 7 solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that 8 no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum 9 appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated 10 under section 2 of this act shall be the Governor of Yap State. The allottee of funds appropriated under 11 12 sections 3 and 4 of this act shall be the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or his designee, 13 14 EXCEPT THAT the allottee of funds appropriated under 15 subsection 1 of section 3 of this act shall be the Governor of Kosrae State, the allottee of funds 16 17 appropriated under subsection 3(2)(p) of this act shall 18 be the Mayor of Lelu Municipal Government or his 19 designee and the allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 1 of section 4 of this act shall be the 20 Governor of Pohnpei State. The allottee of funds 21 22 appropriated under subsection 5(1) of this act shall be 23 the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or his designee. The allottee of funds appropriated under 24 subsection 5(2)(a) and 5(2)(c) of this act shall be the 25

1	Governor of Chuuk State or his designee. The allottee
