## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend section 203 of title 2 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 10-55, 15-09 and 15-74, and to amend sections 102, 105, 106, 110, 201, 205 and 211 of title 24 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 11-57, 12-34 and 15-38, repealing sections 206, 402, 403 and 504 in their entirety, for the purposes of creating the Fishing Authority Division of the Department of Resources and Development, to eliminate NORMA, and transfer all activities of NORMA to the Fishing Authority Division, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 203 of title 2 of the Code of the
- 2 Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Laws Nos.
- 3 10-55, 15-09 and 15-74, is hereby further amended to read as

- 5 "Section 203. Departments.•
- 6 (1) There shall be the following departments which 7 shall be responsible for major programs or
- 8 administrative support areas in the Government of the
- 9 Federated States of Micronesia:
- 10 (a) Department of Resources and Development, which
- 11 shall contain among other units, a Fishing Authority
- 12 Division;
- 13 (b) Department of Finance and Administration;
- 14 (c) Department of Foreign Affairs; •
- 15 (d) Department of Health and Social Affairs;
- 16 (e) Department of Justice;

1	(f) Department of Transportation, Communication
2	and Infrastructure, which shall contain among other
3	units, a Project Management Unit for the Compact
4	Infrastructure Grants; and
5	(g) Department of Education.
6	(2) The administrative head of each department shall
7	be designated as a "Secretary".
8	(3) The administrative head of each office shall be
9	designated as a "Director".
10	(4) Succession. ●
11	(a) Any reference to a previously existing
12	department, office or division thereof shall apply to
13	the appropriate successor entity.
14	(b) Any reference to any office or employee of an
15	entity referred to in subsection (4)(a) of this section
16	shall be construed as applying to the person holding the
17	same or most similar position in the appropriate
18	successor entity."
19	Section 2. Section 102 of title 24 of the Code of the
20	Federated States of Micronesia, as enacted by Public Law 12-34, is
21	hereby amended to read as follows:
22	"Section 102. <u>Definitions</u> . In this subtitle, except
23	where otherwise specified, the following terms shall
24	have the meanings stated below:
25	(1) 'Access agreement' means a treaty, agreement or

arrangement entered into by the [Authority pursuant to this act] Nation in relation to access to the exclusive economic zone for fishing by foreign fishing vessels, and includes bilateral and multilateral instruments applicable at the national, subregional, regional or international level.

- (2) 'Administrator' means the director of a regional fisheries agency or any other organization or person authorized, pursuant to section 106 of chapter 1 of this subtitle, to administer a fisheries access agreement or fisheries management agreement to which the Federated States of Micronesia is party.
- (3) 'Agent' includes a person appointed or designated by a foreign fishing company to act as the legal representative of that company within the Federated States of Micronesia, including acceptance of and response to legal process, pursuant to section 404(4)(a) of chapter 4 of this subtitle.
- (4) 'Aircraft' means any craft capable of self-sustained movement through the atmosphere and includes helicopters.
- (5) 'Atoll' means a naturally formed coral reef system which has one or more islands situated on the reef system, including, but not limited to, Ngulu, Ulithi, Sorol, Eauripi, Woleai, Faraulep, Ifalik, Olaimarao,

Elato, Lamotrek, West Fayu, Puluwat, Pulap, Pulusuk,

Namonuito, Kuop, Nomowin, Murilo, Losap, Namoluk,

Satawan, Etal, Lukunor, Minto Reef, Oroluk, Nukuoro,

Kapingamarangi, Pakin, Ant, Sapwuahfik, Mwoakilloa and

Pingelap.

- (6) 'Authority' means [the National Oceanic Resource Management Authority] the Fishing Authority Division of the Department of Resources and Development as established by section 201 of chapter 2 of this subtitle.
- (7) 'Authorized observer' means any person authorized in writing by the Authority to act as an observer on fishing vessels for the purposes of this subtitle, including any observer authorized pursuant to the provisions of an access agreement or a fisheries management agreement.
- (8) 'Authorized officer' means any person or category of persons designated pursuant to section 602 of chapter 6 of this subtitle as an authorized officer.
- (9) 'Automatic location communicator' or 'transponder' means a device placed on a fishing vessel that transmits, either in conjunction with another device or devices or independently, information concerning the position, fishing and other activities of the vessel.
  - (10) 'Based in the Federated States of Micronesia'

1 means using land-based facilities in the Federated States of Micronesia to support fishing, including 2 3 location of the home port of a vessel in the Federated States of Micronesia, landing or transshipping all fish 4 harvested within the exclusive economic zone and/or 5 operating under a joint venture arrangement in the Federated States of Micronesia, or under arrangements 8 where the operator of a vessel is participating in 9 shore-based developments or is otherwise making a substantial contribution to the development of the 10 domestic tuna industry. 11 (11) 'Buy' includes: 12 13 (a) barter or attempt to barter; 14 (b) purchase or attempt to purchase; 15 (c) receive on account or consignment; (d) purchase or barter for future goods or for 16 17 any consideration of value; and (e) purchase or barter as an agent for another 18 19 person, and 'buyer' shall have a corresponding meaning. 20 (12) 'Citizen' means a person who is a citizen of the 21 Federated States of Micronesia. 22 (13) 'Closed area' means an area in which fishing is 23 prohibited. (14) 'Closed season' means a period of time during 24

which fishing is prohibited.

1 (15) 'Commercial fishing' means any fishing resulting or intending or appearing to result in the sale or trade 2 3 of any fish which may be taken during the fishing operation, and does not include subsistence fishing. 4 For the purposes of this act, the following shall be 5 presumed to be commercial fishing: 6 7 (a) use of a vessel for fishing which measures twenty-seven (27) feet or more in overall length; 8 9 (b) use of more than one vessel for fishing which is owned by a single person for the primary purpose of 10 selling or trading any fish. 11 12 (16) 'Commercial pilot fishing' means any fishing for the purpose of testing the commercial viability of: 13 14 (a) new fishing methods; 15 (b) developing new stocks of fish; or (c) fishing in previously unexploited areas. 16 17 (17) 'Court' means the Supreme Court of the Federated States of Micronesia. 18 (18) 'Domestic fishing' means any fishing by a local 19 20 fishing vessel longer than twenty-seven (27) feet in 21 overall length, but not including commercial pilot 22 fishing. 23 (19) (Reserved) 24 (20) (Reserved)

Т	(21) 'Drift net' means a gillnet or other net or
2	arrangement of nets which is more than 2.5 kilometers
3	(1.56 miles) in length, the purpose of which is to
4	enmesh, entrap or entangle fish.
5	(22) 'Drift net fishing activities' includes fishing
6	with the use of a drift net and any related activities
7	including transporting, transshipping and processing any
8	drift net catch, and provisioning of food, fuel and
9	other supplies for vessels used or outfitted for drift
10	net fishing.
11	(23) 'Exclusive economic zone' means the exclusive
12	economic zone as defined in title 18 of the Code of the
13	Federated States of Micronesia.
14	(24) 'Executive Director' means the individual
15	appointed by the Authority to be in charge of the daily
16	activities and operation of the authority and to perform
17	such other functions as required by this subtitle.
18	(25) 'Export' means to:
19	(a) send or take out of the country;
20	(b) attempt to send or take out of the country;
21	(c) receive on account or consignment for
22	purposes of paragraph (a) or (b) above;
23	(d) act as an agent for another person for
24	purposes of (a) through (c) above; and
25	(e) carry or transport anything for purposes of

paragraphs (a) through (d) of this subsection, and 'exporter' shall have a corresponding meaning.

- (26) 'Fish' means any living marine resource.
- (27) 'Fish aggregating device' means any man-made or partly man-made floating or semi-submerged device, whether anchored or not, intended for the purpose of aggregating fish, and includes any natural floating object on which a device has been placed to facilitate its location.
- (28) 'Fish processing' means the producing of any substance or article from fish by any method and includes the cutting up, dismembering, cleaning, sorting, loining, freezing, canning, salting, preserving and reduction of fish.
- (29) 'Fisheries management agreement' means any agreement, arrangement or treaty in force to which the Federated States of Micronesia is a party, not including any access agreement, which has as its primary purpose cooperation in or coordination of fisheries management measures in all or part of the region, or implementation of a multilateral access agreement, including, but not limited to, fisheries monitoring, control and surveillance and establishing criteria or requirements for fishing and fisheries access.
  - (30) 'Fishery' or 'Fisheries' means one or more stock

1 of fish or any fishing operation based on such stocks which can be treated as a unit for purposes of 2 3 conservation and management, taking into account geographical, scientific, technical, recreational, 4 economic and other relevant characteristics. 5 (31) 'Fishery waters' means the exclusive economic zone, the territorial sea and internal waters as 8 described in title 18 of the Code of the Federated 9 States of Micronesia, and any other waters over which the Federated States of Micronesia claims sovereignty or 10 11 sovereign Rights. (32) 'Fishing' means: 12 (a) the actual or attempted searching for, 13 14 catching, taking or harvesting of fish; 15 (b) any activity which can reasonably be expected to result in the locating, catching, taking or 16 17 harvesting of fish; (c) the placing, searching for or recovering of 18 19 any fish aggregating device or associated electronic 20 equipment such as radio beacons; (d) any operation at sea directly in support of 21 or in preparation for any activity described in this 22 subsection except for operations defined as related 23

activities in subsection (51) of this section; and

(e) the use of an aircraft in relation to any

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activity described in this subsection except for flights
in emergencies involving the health or safety of crew
members or the safety of a vessel.

- (33) 'Fishing gear' means any equipment, implement, or other thing that can be used in the act of fishing, including any fishing net, rope, line, float, trap, hook, winch, boat, beacon or locating device, aircraft or helicopter.
- (34) 'Fishing vessel' means any vessel, boat, ship or other craft which is used for, equipped to be used for or of a type that is normally used for fishing as the term fishing is defined in subsection (32) of this section.
- (35) 'Flag fishing vessel' means any foreign fishing vessel that is registered in the Federated States of Micronesia pursuant to title 18 of the Code of the FSM and any domestic fishing vessel.
- (36) 'Foreign fishing' means any fishing not defined as domestic fishing, and not including commercial pilot fishing or fishing from a local fishing vessel less than or equal to twenty-seven (27) feet in overall length.
  - (37) 'Foreign fishing vessel' means any fishing vessel other than a local fishing vessel.
  - (38) 'Foreign party' means a noncitizen party to an access agreement or a party to an access agreement that

1 is at least twenty percent foreign-owned. (39) 'Foreign recreational fishing' means fishing using 2 3 a foreign fishing vessel for recreational or sport 4 purposes. (40) 'High seas' means all parts of the sea that are 5 not included in the exclusive economic zone, in the 6 territorial sea, or in the internal water of any nation, 8 or in the archipelagic waters of an archipelagic nation. 9 (41) 'Internal waters' means waters on the landward 10 side of the baseline of the territorial sea of any island within the Federated States of Micronesia. 11 (42) 'Island' means a naturally formed area of land 12 13 surrounded by water, which is above water at high tide. (43) 'Local fishing vessel' means any fishing vessel 14 wholly owned and controlled by: 15 (a) the Government of the Federated States of 16 17 Micronesia, any State government or any subdivision thereof; 18 19 (b) one or more natural persons who are citizens 20 of the Federated States of Micronesia; (c) any corporation, company, society, or other 21 association of persons incorporated or established under 22 23 the laws of the Federated States of Micronesia or of any 24 State and which is wholly owned and controlled by one or

more of the entities or persons described in paragraphs

1 (a) or (b) of this subsection; and

- (d) any combination of persons or entities described in paragraphs (a) through (c) of this subsection.
  - (44) 'Master' in relation to any fishing vessel means the person in charge or apparently in charge of that vessel.
  - (45) 'Multilateral access agreement' means an access agreement between a foreign party and one or more regional parties, to which the Federated States of Micronesia is a party.
  - (46) 'Officer' means any authorized officer or national police officer, and includes any officer of a vessel or aircraft used for the enforcement of this act, whether or not such officers are officials of the Government of the Federated States of Micronesia or of one of the four State governments.
  - (47) 'Operator' means any person who is in charge of or directs or controls a fishing vessel, or for whose direct economic or financial benefit a vessel is being used, including the master, owner, and charterer.
  - (48) 'Owner' in relation to a fishing vessel means any person exercising or discharging or claiming the right or accepting the obligation to exercise or discharge any of the powers or duties of an owner, whether on his own

behalf or on behalf of another, and includes a person who owns the vessel jointly with any other person or persons and any manager, director or secretary of any corporate body or company that holds an ownership interest in the vessel.

- (49) 'Permit' means any permit issued under this subtitle or under an access agreement entered into pursuant to this subtitle.
- (50) 'Person' means any natural person or business enterprise and includes, but is not limited to, a corporation, partnership, cooperative, association, the government of any of the four States, or any political subdivision thereof, and any foreign government, subdivision of such government or other entity.
- (51) 'Port sampler' means a category of authorized observer who performs duties at a point of transshipment or port located either inside or outside the Federated States of Micronesia.
- (52) 'Recreational fishing' means fishing for sport or leisure.
- (53) 'Region' means that area of land and ocean which falls within the sovereignty and sovereign rights of the member countries of the South Pacific Forum Fisheries Agency, whose headquarters are located in Honiara, Solomon Islands, and includes high seas within such

1 area, and for the purposes of data collection, includes that area of the Western and Central Pacific Ocean which 2 3 falls within the jurisdiction and sovereign rights of the member countries of the Secretariat of the Pacific 4 Community located in Noumea, New Caledonia, and 5 'regional' shall have a corresponding meaning. 6 (54) 'Regional access license' means a regional access 8 license issued to any fishing vessel of a party to a 9 multilateral access agreement or fisheries management agreement, in accordance with such agreement. 10 (55) 'Regulation' or 'Regulations' means any regulation 11 12 which may be promulgated by the Authority pursuant to this act. 13 14 (56) 'Related activities' in relation to fishing means: 15 (a) transshipment; (b) refueling or supplying fishing vessels, 16 17 selling or supplying fishing equipment, or performing either activity in support of fishing; and 18 (c) on-shore storing, buying or processing fish 19 20 or fish products from the time they are first landed. (57) 'Secretary' means the Secretary of the Department 21 22 of Justice.

(58) 'Sell' includes the exchange of any fish or fish

product or other thing for cash or for anything which

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has value or which can be exchanged for cash, and includes any exchange by barter.

- (59) 'Stock of fish' means a species, subspecies or other category of fish identified on the basis of geographical, scientific, technical, recreational and economic characteristics which can be treated as a unit for purposes of conservation and management.
- (60) 'Subsistence fishing' means fishing by a citizen or a resident substantially for personal consumption, and does not include any fishing resulting or intending or appearing to result, directly or indirectly, in the sale or trading of any fish which may be taken during the fishing operations.
- (61) 'Transponder' or 'automatic location communicator' means a device placed on a fishing vessel that transmits, either in conjunction with another device or devices or independently, information concerning the position, fishing and other activities of the vessel.
- (62) 'Transshipment' means the transfer of any or all fish or fish products to or from any vessel or aircraft for the purposes of transporting such fish or fish products elsewhere.
- (63) 'United Nations Agreement' means the agreement for the implementation of the provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea of 10 December

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- 1 1992 relating to the conservation and management of
- 2 straddling fish stocks and highly migratory fish stocks.
- 3 (64) 'United Nations Convention' means the United
- 4 Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, 1982.
- 5 (65) 'Vehicle' means any car, truck, van, bus, trailer
- or other powered land conveyance.
- 7 (66) 'Vessel' means any boat, ship, canoe or other
- 8 water-going craft."
- 9 Section 3. Section 105 of title 24 of the Code of the
- 10 Federated States of Micronesia, as enacted by Public Law No.
- 11 12-34, is hereby amended to read as follows:
- "Section 105. Access agreements required.
- 13 (1) No foreign fishing vessel shall be issued a
- 14 permit to fish in the exclusive economic zone unless an
- applicable access agreement is in force.
- 16 [(2) The Authority is authorized to negotiate and enter
- into access agreements on behalf of the Government of the
- 18 Federated States of Micronesia pursuant to chapter 2 and in
- 19 accordance with chapter 4 of this subtitle."]
- 20 Section 4. Section 106 of title 24 of the Code of the
- 21 Federated States of Micronesia, as enacted by Public Law No.
- 22 12-34, is hereby repealed in its entirety.
- 23 Section 5. Section 110 of title 24 of the Code of the
- 24 Federated States of Micronesia, as enacted by 12-34, is hereby
- 25 amended to read as follows:

"Section 110. Permits - sco	ope.
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- (1) A permit issued or renewed under this subtitle shall only be valid for the species of fish, the type of fishing gear or method of fishing, or such other activity in accordance with this subtitle, as may be specified in the permit.
- (2) No permit shall authorize: (a) fishing by foreign fishing vessels on, over or within one nautical mile of the edge of a coral reef that is wholly submerged at mean high tide within the exclusive economic zone;
- (b) fishing by foreign fishing vessels within a two nautical mile radius of any fish aggregating device of the Government, a citizen or any other body established under the laws of the Federated States of Micronesia;
- (c) fishing using a drift net or other substantially similar method of catching fish;
- (d) drift net fishing activities, including the transporting, transshipping and processing of anyl driftnet catch, and the provisioning of food, fuel and other supplies for vessels used or outfitted for drift net fishing.
- (3) A permit issued to a vessel may authorize fishing on, over or within one nautical mile of the edge of a coral reef that is wholly submerged at mean high

tide within the exclusive economic zone, only if: 1 (a) the applicant's permit application provides 2 adequate support for marine scientific research or 3 commercial pilot fishing in such area; and 4 (i) with respect to commercial pilot fishing, 5 the Authority has determined that commercial pilot 6 fishing at the levels proposed in the permit application 8 will not damage the sustainability of the fishery 9 resources; or 10 (ii) with respect to marine scientific research, the Authority has determined that the research 11 methodology proposed in the permit application will not 12 13 damage the sustainability of the fishery resources; or (b) the Authority has determined that such fishing 14 is commercially viable and sustainable; and 15 (c) [the Executive Director] head of the Fishing 16 17 Authority has submitted a copy of the application to the 18 Governor of the FSM State whose customary inhabitants have been traditionally ascribed the authority to 19 20 control the fishing over such reef; and 21 (d) within seventy-five (75) days of the Governor of the concerned FSM State having received such 22 23 submission, the Governor of the concerned FSM State, on

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behalf of either the State government or the State's

customary or traditional leadership, has communicated in

1	writing to the Executive Director its consent to the
2	issuance of the permit with respect to the reef or reefs
3	traditionally ascribed to its customary inhabitants."
4	Section 6. Section 201 of title 24 of the Code of the
5	Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Law No.
6	15-38, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
7	"Section 201. [National Oceanic Resource Management
8	Authority Fishing Authority Division - established.
9	(1) There is hereby established a [National Oceanic
L O	Resource Management Authority Fishing Authority
L1	Division ('Authority') as a unit of the Department of
L2	Resources and Development. [composed of five members,
L3	each discharging a national duty and charged with
L4	responsibility for overseeing the FSM exclusive economic
L5	zone, and appointed as follows:
L6	(a) one member from each FSM State appointed by
L7	the President of the Federated States of Micronesia, in
L8	consultation with the Governor and with the advice and
L9	consent of the Congress; and
20	(b) one at large member appointed by the
21	President of the Federated States of Micronesia with the
22	advice and consent of the Congress.
23	(c) No member shall be appointed for more than
24	two consecutive terms after the effective date of this

(3) The Authority shall choose a chairman by a 10 majority vote of the members of the Authority. 11 (4) The Authority shall meet at such time and place as 12 may be designated by the Chairman or by vote of the 13 members pursuant to any method set out in the Authority 14 bylaws. 15 (5) The Authority shall adopt its own bylaws governing 16 the conduct of its business and performance of the 17 18 powers and duties granted to or imposed upon it by law. (6) A quorum of the Authority shall consist of a 19 20 majority of all voting members. All official business 21 of the Authority shall be conducted by a majority of those members present and voting at a meeting of the 22 23 Authority for which a quorum exists, unless otherwise provided by law or the bylaws of the Authority."] 24 Section 7. Section 205 of title 24 of the Code of the 25

Federated States of Micronesia, as enacted by Public Law No. 12-34, is hereby amended to read as follows: 2 "Section 205. Authority - duties and functions. 3 In addition to the regulatory authority granted in 4 the preceding section, the Authority shall have the following duties and functions: to provide technical assistance in the 8 delimitation of the exclusive economic zone in 9 accordance with section 107 of title 18 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia; 10 [(2) to negotiate, conclude and implement access 11 12 agreements and fisheries management agreements in 13 accordance with sections 105 and 106 of chapter 1 of this subtitle and chapters 4 and 5 of this subtitle; 14 to issue fishing permits in accordance with this 15 16 subtitle: 17 to issue permits for fishing in the 18 territorial sea or internal waters of an FSM State as authorized pursuant to section 118 of chapter 1 of this 19 20 subtitle; 21 to regulate related activities in accordance with this subtitle; 22 23 to coordinate and implement fisheries monitoring and control as required under this subtitle and 24 under international treaties to which the Federated 25

States of Micronesia is a party; 1 [(7) to cooperate as appropriate with other nations or 2 territories in the region and with foreign 3 states fishing in the region and adjacent high seas area 4 for the conservation and management of highly migratory fish stocks; to cooperate in and coordinate as appropriate with 8 each FSM State on fisheries management measures in the 9 exclusive economic zone and territorial sea; 10 to convene and chair a Fisheries Management and Surveillance Working Group as set forth in section 11 12 207 of this chapter; 13 [(10) to employ a full time Executive Director and 14 such other staff as it may deem necessary;] (11) to submit the Authority's budget and 15 report regarding the expenditure of its funds to the 16 Congress each regular session for review; 17 18 (12) to contribute to the planning of programs relating to fisheries, or fishing in the exclusive economic 19 20 zone, in which an FSM State government or the Government 21 of the Federated States of Micronesia, or any agency or subdivision thereof, has a proprietary interest, direct 22 23 or indirect, by way of stock ownership, partnership, joint venture or otherwise; and 24 25 (13) to perform such other duties and functions as may

1 be necessary to carry out the purpose of this subtitle." Section 206 of title 24 of the Code of the 2 3 Federated States of Micronesia, as enacted by Public Law No. 12-34, is hereby repealed in its entirety. Section 9. Section 211 of title 24 of the Code of the 5 Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Law No. 7 15-38, is hereby further amended to read as follows: 8 "Section 211. Annual report. The Chairman of the Authority 9 shall present a written report annually on its activities to the [President of the Federated States of Micronesia, the 10 Speaker of the Congress of the Federated States of 11 12 Micronesia, and each FSM State Governor] the head of R&D by 13 December 1st of each year, which report shall contain a detailed accounting of the expenditure of funds of the 1 14 Authority, the number of permits and licenses issued, the 15 fees, forfeitures and fines collected, estimates of the 16 effect of the current level of fishing on the stock of fish 17 in the exclusive economic zone, and such other information 18 regarding the implementation of this subtitle in the 19 20 preceding fiscal year as the Authority may determine. [<del>All</del> departments and offices of the FSM National Government shall 21 be provided copies of the Authority's annual report]." 22 23 Section 10. Section 402 of title 24 of the Code of the 24 Federated States of Micronesia, as enacted by Public Law No.

25 12-34, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

1 Section 11. Section 403 of title 24 of the Code of the 2 Federated States of Micronesia, as enacted by Public Law No. 3 12-34, is hereby repealed in its entirety. Section 12. Section 504 of title 24 of the Code of the 5 Federated States of Micronesia, as enacted by Public Law No. 6 12-34, is hereby repealed in its entirety. Section 13.
