A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, and 9 of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-210, 21-221 and 21-238 to appropriate \$698,367 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the Executive Branch; the Legislative Branch; the Judicial Branch; Grants, Subsidies and Contributions; Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.
