A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 8 and 9 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by Public Law No. 22-60, to appropriate \$4,963,919 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, to provide additional funding for the operations of all branches of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies; National Election; Grants, Subsidies, and Contributions; and Capital and Human Resources Development; and for other purposes.
