

AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 22-86, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 22-101, 22-102, 22-106, 22-140, 22-147, 22-161, 22-168, 22-185, 22-197, 23-06, 23-12, 23-39 and 23-50, by amending sections 2, 5 and 6 thereof, to change the use and lapse date of funds previously appropriated therein, for the purpose of funding priority infrastructure projects and other public projects and social programs for the people of Yap, Kosrae, Pohnpei and Chuuk States, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1           Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law No. 22-86, as amended by  
2 Public Laws Nos. 22-161, 22-168 and 23-06, is hereby further  
3 amended to read as follows:

7 social programs for the people of Yap State.

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1           Section 3. Section 6 of Public Law No. 22-86, as amended by  
2 Public Laws Nos. 22-102, 22-140, 22-168, 23-12 and 23-39, is  
3 hereby further amended to read as follows:

4           "Section 6. Allotment and management of funds and lapse  
5 date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be  
6 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in  
7 accordance with applicable laws, including, but not  
8 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The  
9 allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these  
10 funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used  
11 solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that  
12 no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum  
13 appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated  
14 under section 2 of this act shall be the Governor of Yap  
15 State or his designee. The allottee of funds  
16 appropriated under subsection 3(1) of this act shall be  
17 the Governor of the State of Kosrae or his designee; the  
18 allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 3(2) of  
19 this act shall be the Mayor of Lelu Town Government or  
20 his designee. The allottee of funds appropriated under  
21 section 4 of this act shall be the President of the  
22 Federated States of Micronesia or his designee; PROVIDED  
23 THAT, the allottee of funds appropriated under  
24 subsection 4(1)(c) of this act shall be the FSM  
25 Telecommunication Corporation; the allottee of funds

1           appropriated under subsection 4(1)(g) of this act shall  
2           be the Pohnpei Utility Corporation (PUC); the allottee  
3           of funds appropriated under subsections 4(1)(a),  
4           4(2)(a), 4(2)(b), 4(2)(c), 4(2)(e), 4(2)(f), 4(2)(h),  
5           4(2)(i), 4(2)(j), 4(2)(l), 4(3)(b), 4(3)(c), 4(3)(d),  
6           4(3)(e) 4(3)(f), 4(3)(g) and 4(3)(r) of this act shall  
7           be the Pohnpei Transportation Authority (PTA); the  
8           allottee of funds appropriated under subsections  
9           4(1)(j), 4(2)(d) and 4(3)(l) of this act shall be the  
10          Secretary of the Department of Resources and Development  
11          or her designee; the allottee of the funds appropriated  
12          under subsections 4(1)(b), 4(1)(d), 4(1)(e), 4(1)(f),  
13          4(1)(h), 4(1)(k), 4(1)(l), 4(1)(m), 4(1)(n), 4(2)(g),  
14          4(3)(a), 4(3)(g), 4(3)(h), 4(3)(j) 4(3)(k), 4(3)(p),  
15          4(3)(s) , 4(3)(u), 4(3)(z), 4(3)(aa) and 4(3)(ab), of  
16          this act shall be the Secretary of the Department of  
17          Transportation, Communications and Infrastructure or his  
18          designee; the allottee of funds appropriated under  
19          subsection 4(2)(k) of this act shall be the President of  
20          the COM-FSM or his designee; the allottee of funds  
21          appropriated under subsections 4(1)(i) 4(3)(o) and  
22          4(3)(i) of this act shall be the Secretary of the  
23          Department of Health and Social Affairs or her designee;  
24          the allottee of funds appropriated under subsection  
25          4(3)(m) of this act shall be the Vice President of the

1 Federated States of Micronesia or his designee; the  
2 allottee of funds appropriated under subsections  
3 4(3)(n), 4(3)(v), 4(3)(w), 4(3)(x), of this act shall be  
4 the Meninkeder Lapalap of Madolenihmw. The allottee of  
5 funds appropriated under subsection 4(3)(y) of this act  
6 shall be the Luhkenmenlap of Kitti. The allottee of  
7 funds appropriated under subsection 4(3)(t) of this act  
8 shall be the Pohnpei Utility Corporation (PUC). The  
9 allottee of the funds appropriated under subsections  
10 5(1), 5(2) and 5(7) of this act shall be the Governor of  
11 Chuuk State or his designee; EXCEPT THAT the allottee of  
12 funds appropriated under subsections 5(1)(a) and 5(1)(b)  
13 of this act shall be the Mayor of Weno Municipal  
14 Government or his designee; the allottee of funds  
15 appropriated under subsection 5(1)(i) of this act shall  
16 be the Saramen Chuuk Academy School; the allottee of the  
17 funds appropriated under subsection 5(3) of this act  
18 shall be the Mortlocks Island Development Authority  
19 (MIDA); the allottee of funds appropriated under  
20 subsection 5(4) of this act shall be the Mayor of Weno  
21 Municipal Government or his designee; the allottee of  
22 the funds appropriated under subsection 5(5) of this act  
23 shall be the Southern Namoneas Development Authority;  
24 the allottee of the funds appropriated under subsection  
25 5(6) of this act shall be the Faichuk Development

1 Authority. The authority of the allottee to obligate  
2 funds appropriated by this act shall lapse on September  
3 30, 2026.”

4 Section 4. This act shall become law upon approval by the  
5 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its  
6 becoming law without such approval.
